1. Data protection at a glance

General information

Thank you for your interest in the Web pages of © BonaRes - Centre for soil research. The service provider and operator of the BonaRes website is the BonaRes Centre for Soil Research.

This privacy policy applies to all websites and applications published by the BonaRes Center under the domain 'bonares.de', such as the BonaRes portal (www.bonares.de). The following information provides a simple overview of what happens to your personal data, research data and metadata when you visit our website. Please refer to the following data protection declaration for detailed information on the subject of data protection. (Chapter 2)

Data recording on our website

Who is the responsible party for the recording of data on this website (i.e. the "controller")?

The data on this website is processed by the BonaRes Centre for Soil Research, whose contact information is available under the "Imprint" on this website.

How do we record your data?

We collect your data as a result of your sharing of your data with us. This may, for instance be information you enter into our contact form. Our IT systems automatically record other data when you visit our website. This data comprises primarily technical information (e.g. web browser, operating system or time the site was accessed). This information is recorded automatically when you access our website.

What are the purposes we use your data for?

A portion of the information is generated to guarantee the error free provision of the website (e.g. user administration). Other data may be used to analyze your user patterns in order to optimize the user-friendliness of our websites.

What rights do you have as far as your information is concerned?

You have the right to receive information about the source, recipients and purposes of your archived personal data at any time without having to pay a fee for such disclosures. You also have the right to demand that your data are rectified, blocked or eradicated. Please do not hesitate to contact us at any time under the address disclosed in section "Information Required by Law" on this website if you have questions about this or any other data protection related issues. Analysis tools and tools provided by third parties

There is a possibility that your browsing patterns will be statistically analysed when your visit our website. 2. General information and mandatory information

Data protection

Your privacy and the protection of your research - and metadata are important to us - we respect and protect your privacy and handle your data confidentially, taking into account the applicable legal provisions and this Privacy Policy.

The term "personal data" comprises all data that can be used to personally identify you (e. g. name, institutional affiliation, postal and email address). The processing of your personal data includes the data capturing, storing, use and further processing. Your research- and metadata you submit will be collected and stored by the BonaRes Data Centre in accordance with the rules in the BonaRes Data Guideline (see BonaRes Portal: Research Data/Data Guide).

By your use of the BonaRes - Websites you agree with the processing of your personal, research and metadata in the context of this privacy policy. The uses of the BonaRes - Web pages are generally possible without providing any personal information. Some of the personal data requested for registration in the Project Portal (e.g. name, organization or email address) are optional. No user data will be disclosed to third parties without an explicit agreement of the user (Art.6 Abs.1 lit. A DSGVO).

We want to explicitly point out that data transfer on the internet (e.g. during download or in email communication) may have security gaps. Complete protection of data against access by third parties is therefore not possible and is not guaranteed.

We hereby expressly prohibit the use of the contact data published as part of our duty to publish an imprint for the purpose of sending any advertising or informational material that was not expressly requested. The service provider of the BonaRes Web-Portal reserves the right to take legal action in case of unsolicited sending of advertising and information material, for instance by spam emails.

Revocation of your consent to the processing of data

A wide range of data processing transactions are possible only subject to your express consent. You can also revoke at any time any consent you have already given us. To do so, all you are required to do is sent us an informal notification via e-mail. This shall be without prejudice to the lawfulness of any data collection that occurred prior to your revocation. The research and metadata you have posted will remain available even after the end of the BonaRes project period. The research and metadata you submit to us will remain available after the end of the BonaRes project.

Right to log a complaint with the competent supervisory agency

Furthermore, you have the right to file complaints with regulatory authorities. If there has been a breach of data protection legislation, the person affected may file a complaint with the competent regulatory authorities. The competent regulatory authority for matters related to data protection legislation is the data protection officer of Brandenburg (Germany), the state in which the ZALF is headquartered. Right to data portability

You have the right to demand that we hand over any data we automatically process on the basis of your consent or in order to fulfil a contract be handed over to you or a third party in a commonly used, machine readable format. If you should demand the direct transfer of the data to another controller, this will be done only if it is technically feasible.

SSL and/or TLS encryption

For security reasons and to protect the transmission of confidential content, such as purchase orders or inquiries you submit to us as the website operator, this website uses either an SSL or a TLS encryption program. 4. Recording of data on our website

Cookies

In some instances, our website and its pages (<u>https://bonares.de</u>) use so-called cookies. Cookies do not cause any damage to your computer and do not contain viruses. The purpose of cookies is to make our website more user friendly, effective and more secure. Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer and stored by your browser.

Most of the cookies we use are so-called "session cookies." They are automatically deleted after your leave our site. These cookies are used to ensure the use of internal areas in particular at our project portal, to personalize each user, to prevent fraud and to improve security. These cookies enable us to recognize your browser the next time you visit our website.

You can adjust the settings of your browser to make sure that you are notified every time cookies are placed and to enable you to accept cookies only in specific cases or to exclude the acceptance of cookies for specific situations or in general and to activate the automatic deletion of cookies



when you close your browser. If you deactivate cookies, the functions of this website may be limited.

Server log files

The provider of this website and its pages automatically collects and stores information in socalled server log files, which your browser communicates to us automatically. The information comprises:

- Referrer URL
- The hostname of the accessing computer
- The time of the server inquiry
- The IP address

This data is not merged with other data sources.

This data is recorded on the basis of Art. 6 Sect. 1 lit. f GDPR. The operator of the website has a legitimate interest in the technically error free depiction and the optimization of the operator's website. In order to achieve this, server log files must be recorded.

Contact form

If you submit inquiries to us via our contact form, the information provided in the contact form as well as any contact information provided therein will be stored by us in order to handle your inquiry and in the event that we have further questions. We will not share this information without your consent.

Hence, the processing of the data entered into the contact form occurs exclusively based on your consent (Art. 6 Sect. 1 lit. a GDPR). You have the right to revoke at any time any consent you have already given us. To do so, all you are required to do is sent us an informal notification via e-mail. This shall be without prejudice to the lawfulness of any data collection that occurred prior to your revocation.

The information you have entered into the contact form shall remain with us until you ask us to eradicate the data, revoke your consent to the archiving of data or if the purpose for which the information is being archived no longer exists (e.g. after we have concluded our response to your inquiry). Publication of data in the BonaRes Repository.

Upon publication, your data related to your scientific work will be available on the internet and accessible to an indefinite number of people worldwide. You may object to this processing at any time and request deletion under the conditions of Art. 21 GDPR.

Your data will be published within the BonaRes Data Repository for scientific purposes. Upon publication, your data will be available on the internet and accessible to an indefinite number of people worldwide. You may object to this processing at any time and request deletion under the conditions of Art. 21 GDPR.

6. Analysis tools

Google Analytics

The BonaRes-Web pages (<u>https://www.bonares.de/</u>) use Google Analytics. The provider of this service is **Google Ireland Limited, Gordon House, Barrow Street, Dublin 4, Irland**.

Google Analytics uses so-called cookies. Cookies are text files, which are stored on your computer and that enable an analysis of the use of the website by users. 8. Plug-ins and Tools

YouTube
